### Financing agriculture seminar planned

A seminar for farmers, ranchers and others on attracting capital to agriculture is scheduled for February 16 and 17 at the Ramada Inn in Billings. The seminar is sponsored by Agricultural Management and Economic Consulting (AMEC), Inc., a Bozeman firm.

The seminar begins at noon on February 16 and ends at noon on February 17, according to Dr. LeRoy Luft, president of AMEC, Inc. Luft can be contacted at 315 Hagerty Lane, Bozeman, MT 59715, phone 586-0548, for pre-registration information. Pre-registration is required.

Topics covered in the seminar include but are not limited to: How to find investor financing; the current status of conventional lending; limited partnerships as a source of capital; sale-leaseback arrangements; and management services available to investors and owner-operators.

Experts on agricultural finance will address the participants. Speakers include: Bill Ogden, President of International Finance and Management Group, Minneapolis; Robert Reiquam, President of First Bank, Great Falls; Art Lund, State Farmers Home Administration Director, Bozeman; James Almond, Wells Fargo Agricultural Credit, Billings; John Harlow, Oppenheimer Industries, Kansas City; and George Schwab, Agrivest, Glastonbury, Connecticut.

"This seminar is timely, given the current financial condition of many farmers and ranchers in Montana," Luft said. "The seminar is a 'how to' as well as a 'what to do' session. We will present practical financing options for farmers and ranchers."

Cost for the seminar is \$125 for the first person per farm, ranch or firm; \$100 for the second person from the same enterprise; and \$35 per spouse. In addition to the seminar, the cost includes refreshment breaks, social hour, dinner, and a notebook containing all talks.

### Fee reduced

City Attorney Tom Bigler presented his recommendations for adjustments of the City's beer and wine license fees at Monday evening's City Council meeting.

In a roll call vote the Councilmen unanimously approved Ordinance 416 which amends the Big Timber City Code as follows: a beer and wine license will be \$150.00; wine

license for off-premise use only - \$150.00; wine license for on or off-premise use - \$75.00.

Two businesses will be affected by this change - The Firepit and JD's. The inequity of the license fee schedule was originally brought to the attention of the Council by JD's owner Gerald Dempster.
